Don and his wife, Martha, raised their three children, Dan, Elizabeth, and the late Alan, in Los Alamos.

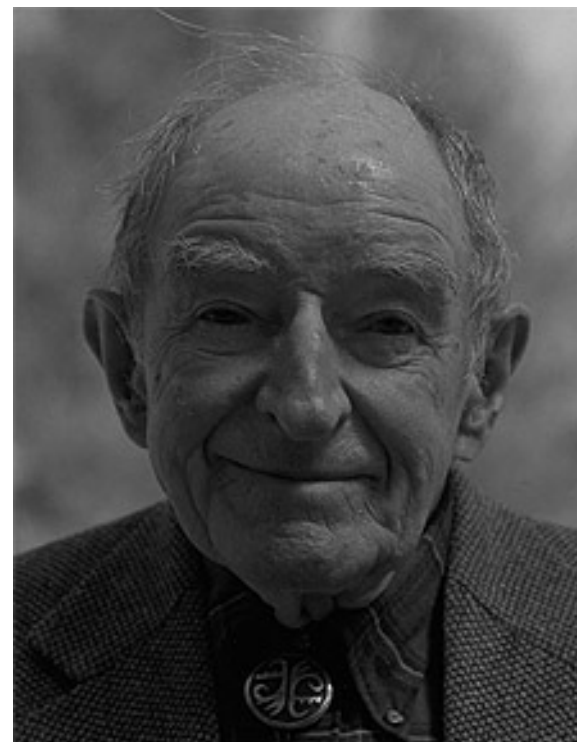

Before Los Alamos became a county, Don was chairman of the Town Council, and was a member of the Charter Commission.

Instrumental in the development of the Peach Street and Sycamore Street group homes, Don has spent decades on issues affecting the developmentally disabled.
